COSTA RICA: Spring Break Service Adventure

Choose your own adventure - support meaningful community development projects or help protect an endangered sea turtle nesting beach.

OVERVIEW

Experience Spring Break in a whole new way! Lend a hand on projects that improve the lives of local residents and the natural world. Costa Rica is a breathtaking, culturally rich country; however, some communities still need extra support, and your efforts can be a big help to its citizens. It's not Spring Break without a bit of adventure, and Costa Rica can supply this in droves! You'll have the chance to enjoy water sports, have fun in the sun, and participate in other activities with your new friends from all over the world.

SPOTLIGHT ON COMMUNITY SERVICE

Community Track

On the community development track, students may work on a variety of projects determined by local community leaders based on what projects are most needed at the time of your arrival. There are many opportunities to serve the community here. For example, you may assist in environmental projects such as planting native tree saplings, or creating signs to promote environmental awareness and sustainability. You could work on initiatives within local schools, such as improving classroom infrastructure or starting a school or community garden.

Sea Turtle Track

On the sea turtle track, students will take to local beaches and participate in clean-up efforts, removing debris that can ensnare young hatchlings making their way to the sea. You'll help local partners as they survey nesting sites and make sure they're primed for the nesting mothers. You also may assist on night patrols with a local nonprofit dedicated to environmental protection and to increasing birth rates for Costa Rica's threatened sea turtle species.

SAMPLE ITINERARY: DAILY BREAKDOWN

Actual schedule of activities will vary by program session. The information detailed here is typical for what you can expect to experience; however, service work and activities vary depending upon the needs of our local community partners, various celebrations and customs, as well as the weather and specific needs of the student group.



DAY 1: WELCOME TO COSTA RICA!

Fly into Liberia (LIR) on the first day of the program, where GLA staff will be ready to welcome you and take you to our Home Base, a beautiful eco-resort on the shores of the Pacific coast. We'll start getting to know our fellow travelers and GLA staff at a brief orientation. Get settled and enjoy your first Costa Rican dinner at Home Base.

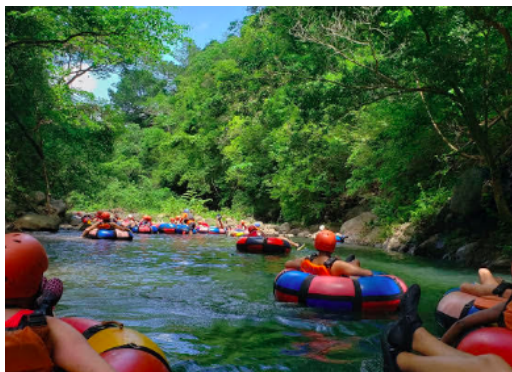
DAY 2: GETTING ORIENTED

We'll kick off our time together with group team building activities, utilizing the gardens, pools, sport fields and sandy beaches around us. You'll also familiarize yourself with your community service site. Meet with the service site leader, meet local neighbors to learn about the socio-economic situation, geographic terrain and environmental status of the region you'll be working in. Tonight, we'll participate in our first Mentor sessions.

DAY 3: TUBING & ZIPLINING ADVENTURE

Enjoy non-stop fun and excitement bouncing and splashing down three miles of Class II and III rapids in the narrow, rushing Rio Negro. There are plenty of quiet pools along the way perfect for appreciating the tropical scenery. The special river tube rafts you'll board are designed with handles and protective bottoms, and you'll have a guide to help point out sights and keep you safe! Later, we'll test our limits and enjoy nature from above the treetops. Challenge yourself to take down eleven zipline cables, all designed to give you an exhilarating





experience while safely soaring through the forest.

DAYS 4-6: COMMUNITY SERVICE

Students will divide into groups to work on a variety of different service projects. Projects may include:

Renovations in the Community: Work at a nearby playground or community resource center, helping with renovation or construction work: sanding, painting, mixing and laying cement, making sure trash and recycling receptacles are updated and available, fixing the walkways and bridges and more. Helping improve these facilities gives the surrounding communities safe and beautiful spaces for play, gathering and education.



Reforestation Projects: Work with local non-profit ROW (Restoring Our Watershed) to make an impact by replenishing forested areas with new trees. Tend to saplings that are being prepared for replanting, plant trees in the field and maintain existing reforestation projects to improve their survival rate. Planting trees and rebuilding a forest cover is critical to retaining rainwater instead of losing it to runoff, and protecting the land from erosion and drought.

Sea Turtle Conservation Efforts: Help protect turtles from poachers: Relocate eggs to the hatchery where they can be monitored, collect biometric data on the beach, release baby turtles into the ocean (depending on whether Mother Nature grants us nesting turtle sightings!), and clean the beach to make the environment more inviting to turtles and plant native species.



DAY 7: SNORKELING & CATAMARAN RIDE

Time for a full adventure day! After breakfast we'll board a cruising boat to a beautiful snorkeling spot, where the water is extremely clear and warm year-round. We'll explore a different world underwater, among friendly schools of fish and colorful coral. Take a swim and relax on the white-sand beaches that Costa Rica is famous for.



DAY 8: DEPARTURE

Sadly, our Costa Rica adventure must come to an end. After completing the program, it's time to exchange goodbyes and see-you-laters with your peers and staff. We'll travel as a group back to your departure airport in Liberia, where GLA staff will help you check in for your flight and see you off on your journey home.

TRAVELING TO COSTA RICA

GLA HOME BASE | Home Base is located in a coastal region of Costa Rica known for its beautiful beaches and protected ecological areas. Students will have access to a pool, large outdoor spaces, tables and chairs in covered areas and a stretch of private beach half a mile away. Students are permitted to visit the beach at the staff's discretion and with supervision. The group will stay in gender-segregated rooms with roommates, and have private bathrooms and air conditioning.

FOOD | Costa Rica is known for its simple diet of rice, beans and a side of meat. The food at Home Base will reflect the traditional dietary staples of the people in Costa Rica. It will be simple, but fresh and healthy and include delicious, locally-grown fruits.

CLIMATE | Although summer is the middle of the rainy season, Costa Rica typically experiences a mini dry season in July. Rainfall decreases significantly for three or four weeks, especially in the northern Pacific. This makes for hot, sunny days and cooling evening rains

Be present

Our mission at GLA is “to inspire the next generation to realize their potential to transform the world and their role in it.” To that end, we expect GLA students to maintain high standards of personal behavior and to be open-minded.
