COSTA RICA: The Initiative for Children™

Embrace Costa Rica's children and make an impact on the next generation in one of two ways: through community development at local schools or via sports leadership.

OVERVIEW

Learn how development issues in rural Costa Rica—from education access to sustainable land use—are related to the wellness of youth. You'll be based in a very small town far from developed tourism hotspots. Bond with children and families from your neighborhood as you volunteer in their schools, help lead environmental education and spend time working with grassroots organizations passionate about engaging the community in more sustainable practices. After service, experience Costa Rica's lush landscapes and outdoor adventure activities like zip lining, river tubing, hiking, lake kayaking, and relaxing in volcanic hot springs. If you choose the 21-day Flagship experience you'll also explore the beaches on the Pacific coast by catamaran and go snorkeling, as well as white water rafting.

SPOTLIGHT ON COMMUNITY SERVICE

Work at a school or community center, where local children spend time every day. With community members and students, improve the infrastructure and conditions of the site, learn about the local challenges since COVID and opportunities available to children in the community. Depending on the needs of the community when you arrive, you might maintain gardens, build a greenhouse where food can be grown, refurbish a classroom or work on repairs, or engage with youth in a variety of activities to enhance their English language skills.

Daily Breakdown

Actual schedule of activities will vary by program session. The information detailed here is typical for what you can expect to experience; however, service work and activities vary depending upon the needs of our local community partners, various celebrations and customs, as well as the weather and specific needs of the student group.

14-Day Program Itinerary

DAY 1: ARRIVAL IN SAN JOSÉ

Fly into San José, the capital of Costa Rica. GLA staff will be at the airport waiting to greet you! We'll drive together to Home Base, located in the town of Santa Teresa. You'll have time to rest up from travel before your first Costa Rican dinner.

DAY 2: INTRO TO SERVICE, LAKE SWIM

We'll dive right into our service project with an orientation to our service projects. Rotate through different schools and

DAYS 14-15: BEACH EXCURSION

After spending the last two weeks in Costa Rica and exploring all that inland has to offer, it's time to head to the beach for an overnight in the lush Guanacaste region, known for its incredible beaches.

We will stay overnight near the beach, where we'll soak in two days of sunshine and beach bliss. Enjoy an ocean catamaran ride, complete with an opportunity to snorkel public areas where you'll help build better infrastructure for classrooms and community centers, and support children in play-based learning activities. Spend the afternoon swimming in your very own private lake behind Home Base!



DAY 3: COFFEE & FAMILY FARMS

Effective community service starts with knowing the community! Today, visit some of the farms that surround the town of Santa Teresa. Students in the schools you'll volunteer at are from the families who work on these pineapple and livestock farms. Hear from a guest speaker about the process of coffee production, one of Costa Rica's main exports.



DAYS 4-6: COMMUNITY SERVICE

Service begins! Work at a school or community center, where local children spend extended time every day. With community members and students, improve the infrastructure and conditions of the site. Learn about the local challenges brought about by the COVID epidemic. Depending on the needs of the community when you arrive, you might maintain gardens, build a greenhouse where food can be grown, refurbish the classroom or work on repairs.

Local schools don't have strong government support, especially in terms of infrastructure. It's important to build safe areas where youth feel motivated and proud to study, and

DAYS 16-18: COMMUNITY SERVICE

In our final days of community service, we will push to complete our initiatives for children in this remote part of Costa Rica and leave a lasting impact for the next generation.

Our last days in Costa Rica call for an epic adventure! Today, paddle down rapids in the Aguas Bravas River before making our journey back to reflect and prepare for departures.

DAY 7: HIKING, HOT SPRINGS & COOKING CLASS

Take a day off from community service, and enjoy hiking to a waterfall near the famous Arenal Volcano. Afterward, relax in amazing hot springs. Follow a local guide who will teach you about the cultural traditions, history and natural features of the area. Wind your way through the farms and enjoy the unhurried pace of life. Back at Home Base, take a cooking class and learn to make a traditional Costa Rican dish!



DAYS 8-12: COMMUNITY SERVICE & LAKE KAYAKING

Over the next several days, rotate through a few schools and summer camps that could use extra helping hands whether that be infrastructure or student support. Cross-cultural interaction provides lasting memories for the students, opening up opportunities for language exchange, various lessons and mutual inspiration.

After several days of working on the community service project, we'll take a break to go kayaking on the lake. Enjoy Costa Rica's natural beauty and understand why this nation is a global leader in promoting environmental stewardship. One evening, we'll go on a short hike near Home Base. Listen to night calls and try to spot sloths, owls, and some of the forest's

TRAVELING TO COSTA RICA

GLA HOME BASE | The is based in Alajuela province, in the town of Santa Teresa. Home Base is an all-wooden lodge surrounded by rural pineapple and sugarcane farms. There are three lakes near the property where students can swim, kayak or fish and enjoy their exclusive sprawling grounds.

FOOD | Costa Rica is known for its simple diet of rice, beans and a side of meat. The food at Home Base will reflect the traditional dietary staples of the people in Costa Rica. It will be simple, but fresh and healthy and include delicious, locally-grown fruits.

CLIMATE | Although summer is the middle of the rainy season, Costa Rica typically experiences a mini dry season in July. Rainfall decreases significantly for three or four weeks, especially in the northern Pacific. This makes for hot, sunny days and cooling evening rains.

LEADERSHIP

Global Leadership Adventures started as an educational institute, so we continue to think and act like educators—not tour operators—as we deliver life-changing programs. We intentionally weave a leadership curriculum into the daily experience on our programs. Through group discussion, meaningful service, workshops, speakers and excursions, staff guide students to reflect on program events through the lens of leadership, and celebrate outstanding examples of leaders they encounter in the local community. Lending this context to the experience creates opportunities for students to dig deep into their vision, purpose and knowledge of themselves and the world.

Be present

Our mission at GLA is "to inspire the next generation to realize their potential to transform the world and their role in it." To that end, we expect GLA students to maintain high standards of personal behavior and to be open-minded. The culture may be different, sometimes shockingly so.
