# GALÁPAGOS: Preserving Nature's Wonders™

Encounter different species of exotic island and marine life, many of them found nowhere else on Earth.

#### **OVERVIEW**

On this program you will experience one of the most pristine natural environments in the world, where Charles Darwin first developed the Theory of Evolution. Volunteer alongside conservationists to help preserve this UNESCO-designated heritage site and unique ecosystem. Besides volunteering, you'll have the opportunity to explore two different islands, snorkel with sea lions and see the world-famous Galápagos tortoises.

#### SPOTLIGHT ON COMMUNITY SERVICE

The native wildlife of the Galápagos faces danger to its local habitat and biodiversity from invasive plant species that were introduced to the archipelago by mankind. Prepare to get your hands dirty! Work at a tortoise refuge center, digging up invasive plants, helping with groundwork and preparing habitat for the tortoises. You'll plant trees to help protect endemic species and restore the natural habitat of the local wildlife.

#### SAMPLE ITINERARY: DAILY BREAKDOWN

Actual schedule of activities will vary by program session. The information detailed here is typical for what you can expect to experience; however, service work and activities vary depending upon the needs of our local community partners, various celebrations and customs, as well as the weather and specific needs of the student group.



#### DAYS 1 - 2: GETTING ORIENTED

Fly into Quito, Ecuador's capital, where GLA staff will be waiting to greet you! We'll drive to the hotel where our group will spend our first and second nights while we explore this historic city. Take in a panoramic view from the hills, and visit old town Quito where we will pass La Basilica church and visit Plaza Grande, La Compania church and La Ronda street. We'll spend the afternoon on day two preparing for our departure to the Galápagos islands, which will include taking a routine COVID-19 test and picking up snacks and any last minute supplies. In the evenings, we will have our orientation and start to explore our different leadership styles.



### DAY 3: JOURNEY TO THE GALÁPAGOS

We'll catch an early morning flight to the Galápagos archipelago and journey to our destination island of Santa Cruz, the second largest island in the Galapagos Island chain. On arrival we take our bags, meet our local guides and make our way to our Home Base. Settle in and take the afternoon to move our legs as we walk to the Charles Darwin Center and National park breeding center to learn about their work in the islands. This will help us to wrap our heads around the delicate and unique ecosystem of the islands and help frame our service work that is to come.



#### DAYS 4-6: SERVICE & ADVENTURE


In the mornings we will take different excursions to some of the islands' most unique locations -- swim in the island's best swimming hole, Las Grietas, a stretch of inland crystal clear emerald green water at the bottom of an earth fracture!

In the afternoons we will begin our important work at El Chato, working to eradicate invasive species that have taken over the land. We will work to restore the landscape to its once pristine state. It happens to be prime habitat for the giant Galápagos tortoise. This is laborious and dirty work, but our efforts are









incredibly important to the long term health of the islands while preserving this unique landscape -- all while eliminating the need to use toxic pesticides to get there.

#### DAYS 7: TORTUGA BAY

Today we will explore Tortuga Bay. This lovely beach is named for the black sea turtles which nest here. The beach at Tortuga Bay Galápagos is a long, fabulous stretch of white sand where you can spot an array of wildlife. Relax and soak in the day with your peers. We will do some leadership activities on the beach and reflect together on how we can bring the culture and learnings with us back home

#### DAY 8: JOURNEY TO SAN CRISTÓBAL

Today we journey to San Cristóbal, the easternmost island in the Galápagos archipelago, as well as one of the oldest geologically. Once we arrive, we will settle into our Home Base in town, enjoy an energizing lunch and spend the afternoon exploring as we hike to Punta Carola beach where we can start to relax into the rhythms of life on this new island.

#### DAY 9: CONSERVATION, HISTORY & HIKING

After a hearty breakfast, hike to the Cristóbal information center to learn about the conservation work. Next we will continue our walk to enjoy another snorkel location -- on the Galápagos Islands, there is always something new and unique to see!

In the afternoon we will continue our service journey where we will meet with a local woman who works to keep the islands clean by recycling plastic and other materials. Her goal is to educate local people and change the mentality around single-use plastics. We will spend a few hours learning about her work and participating in a unique recycling workshop.

After dinner, we reflect in a group on leadership topics, personal motivations and the community's issues that we've observed: The challenges of balancing human needs with biological protection and preservation and the pressure to develop the islands. Gather in Mentor groups for deeper discussion.

#### DAY 10: ISLA LOBOS ADVENTURE

Today we explore the unique Isla Lobos! Isla Lobos is a small, flat island located off the coast of San Cristóbal Island. Beside its rocky shores lie calm waters in which conditions for swimming and viewing marine life are optimal and visibility can reach up to 40 feet. The island is most known for its resident sea lion population--dozens of them play in the turquoise water and dot the white sands where they rest. Bird watch for blue-footed boobies, Darwin finches, brown pelicans, and frigate birds. Enjoy time exploring this otherworldly landscape before we head back to San Cristóbal to relax for the afternoon, get to know one another and reflect on what we have experienced so far on this island.

#### DAY 11: SERVICE & SNORKEL

Start the day with some fresh air and movement as we take a short ride and mellow walk to La Loberia beach to snorkel. You may even have a chance to swim with sea lions as you watch for majestic sea turtles and fish. We will have lunch at a local restaurant to recharge before heading to a school to help with infrastructure projects. We may do some structure refurbishing, painting, or





beautification projects -- whatever the school requests at the time of the program. We will spend the evening wrapping up our time on the islands, discussing how we have been impacted by this once-in-a-lifetime experience.

#### DAY 12: RETURN TO QUITO

Spend the day journeying back to Quito. Settle into your Home Base.

#### DAY 13: VISIT THE EQUATOR

Today we will visit Mitad del Mundo, a monument built exactly where the Equator line passes through Ecuador. Straddle both the northern and southern hemispheres! We'll also explore La Mariscal, a bustling cultural center where our group will pick up souvenirs and explore bustling city streets.

#### DAY 14: DEPARTURE

After an early breakfast and final goodbyes, we'll head to the airport. There, the GLA team will help you check-in and see you off on your return flight home! ¡Buen viaje!

#### TRAVELING TO THE GALAPAGOS

GLA HOME BASE | At the start and end of our journey, we'll stay at a local hotel in Quito. In the Galápagos, we'll spend the first four nights on San Cristobal Island and the next four nights on Santa Cruz Island.

While on the Galapagos islands, (San Cristobal & Santa Cruz) both Home Bases are comfortable, simple hotels owned by local families. Rooms all have private bathrooms with hot showers. Accommodations are basic, but clean and safe. Students stay in gender-segregated rooms with roommates. In Santa Cruz we will eat all of our meals at the Home Base, while in San Cristobal, we will eat all of our meals at a local restaurant.

FOOD | Ecuadorian meals most often consist of rice or noodles with fish or chicken. Other common dishes include soups and patacones (fried plantains). Resources are limited in the remote Galápagos, so we'll be conscious of eating locally and sustainably.

CLIMATE | Located 600 miles west of Ecuador, the Galápagos has a tropical and semi-arid climate, but experiences a cool, dry season each summer. We're likely to experience clouds and mist during our time of travel.

#### **LEADERSHIP**

Global Leadership Adventures started as an educational institute, so we continue to think and act like educators—not tour operators—as we deliver life-changing programs. We intentionally weave a leadership curriculum into the daily experience on our programs. Through group discussion, meaningful service, workshops, speakers and excursions, staff guide students to reflect on program events through the lens of leadership, and celebrate outstanding examples of leaders they encounter in the local community. Lending this context to the experience creates opportunities for students to dig deep into their vision, purpose and knowledge of themselves and the world.

## **Our Expectations**

#### Be present

Our mission at GLA is "to inspire the next generation to realize their potential to transform the world and their role in it."
