THAILAND: Elephant & Education Initiative™

Experience Thai culture as you split your time between working with gentle Asian elephants and teaching English to children.

OVERVIEW

On this program you will journey to enchanting Chiang Mai in northern Thailand, where you'll have a chance to engage with Thai youth as well as Asian elephants. Make unforgettable connections with local students through community service at a rural primary school, and take part in a cultural exchange at a local high school. Then, live alongside elephants at a sanctuary, while you learn about how to care for these animals that are an integral part of Thai culture, conservation and tourism. Cook your own fabulous cuisine, shop at bustling markets and explore the rich history and culture of Thai temples.

SPOTLIGHT ON COMMUNITY SERVICE

Volunteer at a school providing English instruction for local children through classroom time, tutoring, arts, crafts and sports. Develop meaningful relationships with your students—serve not only as their teacher, but also a role model, mentor and friend. On the 21-day Flagship Program, you'll also volunteer on various physical projects that support Thailand's ethnic minorities, the Northern hill tribes. Accelerate refurbishment efforts to shelters and infrastructure for these displaced families who have historically been marginalized.

SAMPLE ITINERARY: DAILY BREAKDOWN

Actual schedule of activities will vary by program session. The information detailed here is typical for what you can expect to experience; however, service work and activities vary depending upon the needs of our local community partners, various celebrations and customs, as well as the weather and specific needs of the student group.





WEEK ONE: WORKING WITH ELEPHANTS

DAY 1: WELCOME TO THAILAND!

Touch down in Chiang Mai, a city in northern Thailand known for its mountains and jungles, as well as a more laid-back feel than some of Thailand's larger cities. GLA staff will greet you upon your arrival, and we will drive together to our first Home Base on the grounds of an elephant sanctuary. Over dinner, take the opportunity to get to know your fellow students and have your first taste of Thai cuisine--it might not be what you would expect!

DAY 2: BEGIN WORK WITH THE ELEPHANTS

After a hearty breakfast, we'll have orientation with GLA staff and the Thai staff who run the elephant sanctuary. Go on a guided walking tour of the sanctuary grounds where we'll be living for the next week, with an introductory talk about current issues facing captive and wild elephant populations. We'll have the chance to feed the majestic animals who reside in this sanctuary. With increasing development in Thailand and around the world to accommodate growing human populations, how do we sustainably coexist with wildlife? After a tasty Thai dinner, we'll have our first Mentor session to further unpack these complex issues.

DAY 3: MAINTAINING A SANCTUARY & LIFE ABROAD

Rise early to help plant and harvest food for the elephants. Today you'll see what it takes to maintain a safe space for wildlife. We'll plant and harvest banana trees, spend time with the caretakers and work on various projects. In the evening, hear from a guest speaker about living the "expat life"—what it's like to travel for work, and live abroad long-term.











DAYS 4-5: SERVICE WITH ELEPHANTS & LOCAL MARKETS

Another early day! At the elephant sanctuary, this will be the norm. Spend a few hours in the morning preparing food and feeding the elephants. Early mornings are peaceful and beautiful in Chiang Mai, surrounded by mist and lush mountains. We'll travel to the local market where you'll see lots of regional produce and artisan goods. Do some of your own shopping here, as well as shopping for the elephants: Supplementary food and items for the sanctuary can be found in the street stalls.

DAY 6: THAI TEMPLES & NIGHT BAZAAR

We'll leave the elephant sanctuary today and head off for our next adventure, saying goodbye to the staff who run the sanctuary and the gentle giants we've grown close to. On our way to Home Base #2, we'll stop at several beautiful Thai temples, which are gateways to Thai culture. We'll chat one-on-one with an older monk; open your mind to different philosophies and consider what cultures across the globe can do to empathize with each other. In the evening, we'll settle into our new Home Base before visiting the bustling Night Bazaar. Shop for beautiful textiles, souvenirs and street food!

DAY 7: CULTURAL EXPLORATION & MUAY THAI

Today, you'll take a class from a local instructor on the ancient tradition of Muay Thai boxing. Learn about the history of Muay Thai and test your athleticism as you learn basic moves. You're guaranteed to get a good workout today!

We'll also visit Thai markets, local parks and attractions, and Doi Suthep, a famous mountain temple, as we further immerse ourselves in the local culture.

WEEK TWO: WORKING IN EDUCATION

DAY 8: PREPARE FOR TEACHING

Learn about social issues that exist in Chiang Mai, especially in relation to education and how it affects the quality of life. We'll start with orientation and do lesson-planning in preparation for our new service project: teaching students in rural Chiang Mai. We're hoping to create some excitement around staying in school and to help fill the gaps for those falling behind for critical exams.

DAYS 9-11: TEACH ENGLISH IN THE CLASSROOMS

Travel to a local government primary school. Today we'll begin teaching. Be prepared to adjust your lesson plans, stay energetic and on your feet for several hours and improvise games to help your students stay engaged and learning! In today's globalized society, English language abilities help with job security everywhere, especially in communities where tourism is a major industry. Take mental notes to share in our evening session about the differences between Thai schools and schools we've experienced.





DAY 12: BIKING & KAYAKING AT SI LANNA NATIONAL PARK

Si Lanna National Park is a mountainous national park in Chiang Mai province. We'll drive out to see its numerous waterfalls, caves and springs. Bike through lush rice paddies and fields on the many trails surrounding the park, and learn basic paddling and maneuvers as you kayak across the lake

DAY 13: TEMPLES, MARKETS & REFLECTION

Visit one last temple and the local market for some last-minute buys, then spend time with your GLA family to reflect on your time in Chiang Mai and what it has meant to you. We'll celebrate the end of our journey together with a farewell dinner at a popular Thai restaurant.

DAY 14: DEPARTURE

Head back to the Chiang Mai Airport with memories that will last a lifetime! Staff will assist students with checking in and accompany them until they have safely departed for their gates. *Sawat dee*, Thailand!

TRAVELING TO THAILAND

GLA HOME BASE | GLA operates two Home Bases, both of which are small resorts on the outskirts of Chiang Mai. Accommodations are well-appointed, clean and safe. Students sleep in gender-segregated rooms with roommates, and have access to a pool and bathrooms with hot-water showers.

FOOD | Thai cooking is known for its strong, aromatic components and a spicy edge. Dishes prepared at Home Base will be healthy and balanced, commonly including rice and noodles, and Chiang Mai will be an excellent place to sample classic Northern Thai favorites. Students with nut, soy or shellfish allergies, as well as strict vegetarians or vegans should contact GLA to inform staff and ensure dietary needs can be met.

CLIMATE | Thailand in summer is an extremely hot and humid place. Although you won't be visiting during the height of the rainy season, the chances of rain throughout the day are likely. This is no detriment to travel in Thailand, as the rains can be cooling and refreshing, and showers typically do not last very long.

LEADERSHIP

Global Leadership Adventures started as an educational institute, so we continue to think and act like educators—not tour operators—as we deliver life-changing programs. We intentionally weave a leadership curriculum into the daily experience on our programs. Be present

Our mission at GLA is "to inspire the next generation to realize their potential to transform the world and their role in it." Mentorship

GLA is not a therapy program. Our staff are highly skilled, professional, caring and fun, but they are not licensed therapists. GLA programs can be physically and emotionally demanding, and applicants should be in good physical and mental health.
